



IIS 6.0: ISO files and MIME types

IIS 6.0 will not serve unknown file types, by default. If you want to, for example, make .iso files available, you must explicitly allow it.

It's a fairly simple fix:

1. In the Internet Services Manager console in Windows Server 2003, right-click on the server name and choose properties.
2. Click the MIME types button, enter .iso for the file type and "application/octet-stream" for the MIME-type.
3. Restart the World Wide Web Publishing Service and you're done.
